Plan and design wired and wireless network solutions for SMB customers

- Consult with an SMB customer to assess their business and technical needs and create a plan for a networking solution
 - o Gather/Analyze customer business requirements
 - o Plan for cable and port requirements
 - o Plan for bandwidth and QoS requirements (Including types of traffic, iSCSI etc.)
 - o Plan for critical and high traffic users/servers
 - o Plan for anticipated future growth of network
 - o Plan for serviceability and management
 - o Plan for mobility and wireless
 - o Plan for security
 - o Plan for voice
 - o Plan for green IT
- Design a networking solution to meet the customer needs identified in the planning stage
 - o Specify number of ports and types including:
 - o Determine speed requirements including: Access speed, uplink speed, backplane speeds
 - o Design network topology
 - o Determine types of media
 - o Determine number uplinks required
 - o Determine redundancy scheme including: spanning tree topology, layer 3 routing protocols, link aggregation or when multiple links per host are required
 - o Assess business requirements and design all elements of network security into a single, integrated security solution
 - o Specify network management tools to be used
 - o Design wireless & mobility
- Identify and describe best practices for designing solutions
 - o Take advantage industry standards and HP developed best practices
 - o Take into consideration HP Networking strengths in the design
 - o Sflow and traffic monitoring

Install, configure, startup, and upgrade the network solutions for SMB customers

- Prepare for and install networking equipment
 - o Perform pre-project survey to validate appropriate design
 - o Install modules and components in devices in specified slots based on manufacturer and design requirements
 - o Build initial configuration files as required by design
 - o Update firmware and initial configuration files
 - o Perform specific configuration of devices - Device name, Port names, VLANs, Routing, Certificates, Spanning Tree, SSIDs, PoE, DHCP Servers and Relays, etc.
 - o Configure WAN devices
 - o Implement required security devices
 - o Physically connect devices per design requirements
- Install and configure management and administration solution
 - o Install management software (PMC+)
 - o Configure management software per design requirements (Application security)
 - o Run device discovery for specified devices
 - o Run and store default reports including discovered devices, network map, etc.
 - o Develop and implement management policies per design requirements
- Validate installed solution
 - o Install management software (PMC+)
 - o Configure management software per design requirements (Application security)
 - o Run device discovery for specified devices
 - o Run and store default reports including discovered devices, network map, etc.
 - o Develop and implement management policies per design requirements

Optimize wireless, switched, and routed network infrastructures for SMB customers

- Manage network assets using HP and 3rd party tools
 - o Interpretation of counters and logs
 - o Use HP tools to ease deployment of multiple devices
 - o Interpret output of or data within existing HP tools
- Optimize network performance by improving segmentation and topology
 - o Small scale capacity planning - thinking ahead, planning for expansion and future growth
 - o Verify identified bottleneck or limitation
- Optimize L3 routing protocol convergence and scalability
 - o Tune advanced layer 3 routing protocols, including dynamic and static
- Optimize network availability
 - o Implement trunking
- Optimize and scale wireless network configuration
 - o Use wireless optimization tools and techniques
 - o Optimize RF Coverage, User count, and cell size adjustments
- Optimize security on wired/wireless networks and devices
 - o Centralize security implementation and administration
- Optimize power utilization by implementing Green IT practices
 - o Implement Power, Cooling, PoE

Troubleshoot wireless, switched, and routed network infrastructures for SMB customers

- Troubleshoot routed and switched networks
 - o Describe specific tools appropriate for troubleshooting wired or wireless networks, and manage network assets using appropriate tools
- Troubleshoot remote connectivity
 - o Troubleshoot VPNs

o Troubleshoot mobile devices (tablets, phones and laptops)
